Our work rehabilitating seals started back in the 1980's, when the first abandoned pup was brought to us for care. Nowadays we rescue up to 20 seal pups found sick, injured or stranded on Scotland's shores every year.

Our Animal Care team provide the pups with all the specialist treatment needed for recovery. Once pups are well enough to return to the wild they are released, or for those too poorly to return we provide a new home at the Sanctuary.



HOW IT ALL STARTED

Opened in 1979, the Scottish Seal Sanctuary is dedicated to John Mace, who recognised a growing public interest in our marine environment.

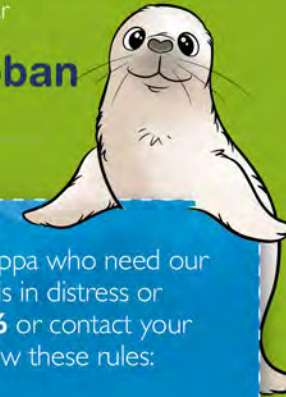

- DON'T** attempt to handle the pup
- DON'T** ignore the situation



CONSERVATION 2017

Here at the Scottish SEA LIFE Sanctuary we rescue and care for seals and other marine creatures in need of help. By sharing their stories with you we hope that you will join us in safeguarding both them and others who might need help in the future. As part of our work we actively support a number of local conservation initiatives including:



Protecting Vulnerable Turtles

Our dedicated turtle area provides a home and care for vulnerable freshwater turtles. We are also working with partner organisations to help promote awareness of threats faced by a wide range of marine creatures.



Rescuing Seals

Each year we help rescue and rehabilitate up to 20 seals. After treatment in our Seal Hospital they are released back into the wild or provided a safe new home with all the specialist care they need.



Red Squirrel Conservation

Through our ongoing research into squirrel populations across Scotland, we are able to help safeguard the population of native endangered red squirrels. Whilst exploring our forest nature trails you may be lucky enough to see resident red squirrels foraging for food.
